

Session 7 Quiz (Rules 12 & 13) - ANSWERS

- 1.a. FALSE. Rule 13.1c(2). Aeration holes are regular maintenance practice that may not be repaired.
 - b. TRUE. Rule 13.1f(2). Interference now exists on a wrong green in reference to stance.
 - c. FALSE. Rule 13.2a(3). Removing a flagstick with a ball in motion is an intent Rule and the penalty is applied whether or not the ball strikes the flagstick.
 - d. TRUE. Rule 13.2b(2) If the ball accidentally strikes the flagstick, there is no penalty and the ball is played as it lies.
 - e. TRUE. Rule 13.1a & 2.2a. If any part of the ball touches the green, it is on the green.
2. **C. Todd is not penalized.** Rule 13.1c(2). Todd is allowed to repair damage made by the flagstick as specifically listed in the Rule.
3. **D. There is no penalty.** Rule 13.2a(1). Taylor is allowed to re-center the flagstick and strike the flagstick with a stroke made from the putting green.
4. **A. No penalty, Doug may touch the leaves.** Rule 12.2b. There is now never a penalty for touching or removing loose impediments from a bunker. The restrictions remain for touching the sand in a bunker.
5. **A. No penalty this procedure is allowed.** Rule 12.2b(3). Jacque may rake the bunker she just played from without exception. This is the same ruling from the old Decision 13-4/37.
6.
 - a. NO PENALTY. Rule 12.2a. Loose impediments may be removed when your ball is in a bunker.
 - b. PENALTY. Rule 12.2b(1). A player may not touch the sand while making a practice swing.
 - c. NO PENALTY. Rule 12.2b(2). Striking the sand in anger is not a penalty.
 - d. NO PENALTY. Rule 12.2b(2) A player may rake a bunker as long as they do not improve the conditions that affect the stroke.
 - e. PENALTY. Rule 12.2b(1). This is a violation of testing the bunker to get information. Same as Decision 13-4/0.5.
