

Session 11 Quiz (Rule 20) - ANSWERS

1.
 - a. FALSE. Rule 20.1a. A player must continue play or play a second ball and cannot delay play.
 - b. FALSE. Rule 20.1b(4). A player does not have a right to play a second ball in match play.
 - c. FALSE. Rule 20.1b(3). A player may request a ruling up until the match is posted as final or may have a timely request after the competition is closed in other circumstances.
 - d. FALSE. Rule 20.1b(1). Players are disqualified if they deliberately agree to not apply a Rule or apply a rule in an incorrect manner.
2. **A. The match stands as played.** Rule 20.1b(3). Baile did not know she was violating a Rule and Taylor did not make a request for a ruling in time.
3. **B. The hole is halved as agreed on by the players.** Rule 20.1b(1). The players may agree to consider a hole halved, as long as a stroke has been played and they are not deliberately applying a Rule incorrectly. If the referee was assigned to their match, Jacque's request for a ruling would be valid.
4. **A. Taylor is the rightful winner and must be awarded the trophy.** Administrative errors such as this do not have a time limit for correction. Therefore, Taylor must be awarded the trophy.
5. **D. Doug is disqualified for not reporting to the committee.** When Doug decided to play 2 balls and made a stroke, he is now proceeding under 20.1c(3) and is required to report to the committee. He is not required to hole out both balls, but if the committee were to choose the ball to count is not holed out, a disqualification penalty must be imposed.
6.
 - a. FALSE. Rules 20.1c(3) and 6.3. Playing a wrong ball is a penalty that must be applied to both balls in this situation. It is irrelevant that he thought he was playing the second ball and it was ruled not to count.
 - b. TRUE. Rule 20.2c. the naked eye standard overrules any video evidence.
 - c. FALSE. Rule 20.2e. Many disqualification penalties may be applied after the result is final. Deliberately disregarding a penalty, cheating or serious misconduct after an event are all viable reasons to disqualify a player after the competition is closed.
 - d. FALSE. Rule 20.2d. A wrong ruling must stand after a competition is final. There are numerous instances when a penalty may be applied or revoked, but not all wrong rulings must be corrected.
